Was a Woman. The thesis of Greta Schiller's absorbing documentary is that Paris between the wars contained more than Joyce, Hemingway and other exiled males, There was a network of women writing, painting, running the bookshops and magazines. This is scarcely bombshell news: Gertrude Stein has long been a Parisian trophy and no coverage of Joyce can escape Sylvia Beach, publisher of Ulysses.

No matter Schiller makes wonderful use of her archive footage. Paris street scenes, home movies, interviews old and new all are served with a flourish and a delight in human oddity. These were special people, in a special age; and it is a delight to be in their company.
